Universal Design for Learning (UDL): Using Inclusive Design to Reduce Barriers to Learning (10:30am – 12:30pm Central) with Zach Petrea, Ed.D.

This presentation will review the guidelines for Universal Design for Learning that might be
utilized in EMDR basic training. These guidelines offer a set of concrete suggestions that
can be applied to ensure that all learners can access and participate in meaningful
learning opportunities.

**Zach Petrea, Ed.D.** is an English Professor at Heartland Community College, where for 20 years he has advocated for curriculum development in order to foster student success through roles as Chair of the Curriculum Committee, Writing Program Coordinator, and Dual Credit Coordinator for the Liberal Arts & Social Sciences.
